## About Fort A.P. Hill...

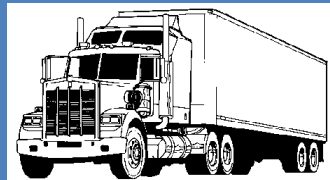
Lots of rumors are floating around about why the BSA is not going back to “The Hill” in 2013.

The Army continues to expand the role Fort A. P. Hill plays in training our troops. Those of you who attended the 2005 Jamboree will notice many additions to the base. As an example of the increased use at the base, the number of troops trained in 2005 was 45,000, while the number the Army expects to train in 2009 is over 93,000. This has put increasing stress on the base facilities and is causing the space available to the Jamboree to continue to shrink.

## Merit Badge Midway

Eighty-two merit badges were represented at the 2005 jamboree. For 2010, organizers are shooting for all 121 merit badges to be represented!
